

ROLE OF A SCORER in the Eastbourne Netball League

The role of scorers in our league is very important.

Scorers do not have to be players. They can be spectators, substitutes, family member and do not have to be registered to England netball.

There will be 2 scorers, one provided by **each club**. They will need to stand **together** at a point that does not interfere with play, but within hearing distance of the umpires. Scorers work together as a team for the duration of the game.

If they are needed on court, the player leaving court should replace the previous scorer.

Teams are to supply the scorer with a **pencil** and small board to lean on. The umpires will supply the score card.

Scorers are **not to coach** any team they are scoring for.

Scorers can praise, “Well done Mavis”
But not coach, “drop back Ethel”

1. **Record goals** for each team as they occur on a score card/pad provided by the umpire(s).
An example is shown below:

2. **Keep** record of the centre pass (at the **start** of each quarter), and call the centre pass if **appealed** to by the umpire. In the example shown, the centre pass is to team B (odd number of goals scored overall)

3. **Notify** the umpires if the **wrong** C pass is indicated or called.

4. Record any **suspensions** and/or **ordering off**

5. One scorer will call out the score loudly after **each goal** scored for the information of the players and/or any spectators.

If there are any **concerns**, the scorer may appeal to **either umpire** for assistance.
